Smashing Times International Centre for the Arts and Equality, Front Line Defenders and a range of partners, present the seventh annual, international Irish Arts and Human Rights Festival running for ten days from the 10 to 19 October 2025. The festival features exciting and innovative events that promote equality, human rights and diversity through the arts, taking place in a range of counties across the island of Ireland.

he 2025 festival comprises over sixty events including five multidisciplinary exhibitions with 198 days of viewing; twelve live theatre shows with 30 performances; one installation; seven children and youth workshops; three launches with artist talks; two music shows; three film screenings; six artist-curator-quest speaker panel talks and discussions; one major international environment eco-conference; two walking tours; two radio shows with Dublin South FM; one unveiling and one online interview. The aim of the festival is to showcase and highlight the extraordinary work of human rights defenders in Ireland and around the world, past and present, and the role of the arts and artists in promoting human rights today. The artistic curator for the festival is Mary Moynihan, Artistic Director, Smashing Times and the human rights curator is Laura O'Leary, International Events and Promotions Coordinator, Front Line Defenders.

Flagship events include From the Forest to the Ocean, a major multidisciplinary exhibition by artists Mary Moynihan and Hina Khan, 16 September to 2 November, 2025, at Rathfarnham Castle; a world premiere of Memorial Monologues: The Path of Memory Part 2 by Mary Moynihan on site at The Iveagh Gardens, Dublin, in partnership with Front Line Defenders, and a range of events taking place at the new Smashing Times centre, 30 Sandycove Road, Dublin, A96V9P1, the first Arts and Human Rights centre in Ireland.

Join us for a range of events presented by Front Line Defenders including the Human Rights Open Mic Night at the Button Factory; the Mother City Film Screening and Discussion on land and housing in Dublin and Cape Town at the Pearse Centre and From Mexico to Ireland; a discussion on corporate responsibility & Human Rights featuring a live panel discussion with woman Human Right Defender Grecia Eugenia Rodríguez Navarro, from the Zacatecas Mining Conflict Observatory, Mexico who shares her testimony of resistance and resilience from the front lines. Also at the Pearse Centre is a live interview presented by Front Line Defenders with Lana Estemirova who talks about her book 'Please Live: The Chechen Wars, My Mother and Me" and the story of her mother, Natalya Estemirova, murdered in Chechnya in 2009 for her human rights work. Lana Estemirova is a presenter of the Trouble with the Truth podcast, and works for the Justice for Journalists Foundation.

The festival is a hybrid programme delivered over 10 days with a number of events running before and after the festival from August to December 2025, reaching audiences locally, nationally, and internationally. The festival hosts an exciting blend of events happening in-person and online, featuring Irish and international artists and guest speakers. There is something for everyone interested in the arts for equality, human rights, and diversity.



Irish in Resistance during World War II is a multidisciplinary installation featuring visual art, photography, film, poetry, and storytelling. The installation reflects on stories of Irish people in resistance during the Holocaust and World War II who stood up against fascism and totalitarianism, and spoke out for the rights of others. The installation features original artworks by Hina Khan, visual artist; Amna Walayat, visual artist; Féilim James, writer and poet; and Mary Moynihan, writer, poet, creator of art and photograph, created in response to stories of people who stood up for the rights of others. Alongside these artworks we have original artworks by Noah Sex, visual artist, and Jessica Rodrigues, visual artist, whose work highlights themes of peace, equality or human rights through powerful artistic expression, sparking dialogue and new visions for the future.

Around the world, communities are resisting destructive extractive projects that threaten their ancestral lands, access to water, livelihoods and the planet. In this live panel discussion, the woman Human Right Defender Grecia Eugenia Rodríguez Navarro, from the Zacatecas Mining Conflict Observatory, Mexico will share her testimony of resistance and resilience from the front lines. Her story will be the starting point for a broader conversation linking local struggles in Latin America (and other regions from the global south) with the responsibility of the Global North, including Ireland and the European Union, to ensure that companies based here respect human rights and the environment abroad. Grecia Rodríguez is a human rights defender who founded the Zacatecas Mining Conflict Observatory in 2016, an organization that has become an ally in the struggle against mines and dams that threaten the lives of people in Zacatecas, Mexico.
